

Kingfisher Singing Activities

The TrinityLearning Kingfisher singing group usually visits Kingfisher school weekly to sing songs with children in several classes. As the group is unable to come in at the moment they have made some simple videos of some of the songs they would usually sing.

Choosing Songs

The Kingfisher singing group has noticed that lots of children really enjoy choosing which song or verse to sing. We have included a set of laminated cards with a picture for each song, and another set with a picture for each verse of Old MacDonald. Show your child 2 or 3 pictures so they can indicate which one they would like to try.

Using your scarves



Try floating the scarf over your arms and face. It may feel tickly or soft. Wave the scarf to feel the air move over you.

Watch the pretty colours float around as you sing the songs – ‘Wave our scarves’ and ‘I can sing a rainbow.’

Wrist Bells and Egg shakers

These instruments make a great sound and are good for releasing energy and having fun making quiet and loud noises. Either attach the bells to your wrist or hold them to shake whilst singing ‘Mama’s sleeping’

Castanets



The castanets are great for making a sound and keeping a beat at the same time.

Try clicking them fast and slow, soft and hard and then keep the beat playing the castanets whilst singing ‘Five little men in a flying saucer’ and ‘When I Was One...Pirate Song’

You can make different animal noises whilst clacking your castanets. Quack quack, woof woof, ribbet ribbet.
